NetWork Kansas Launches New Business Loan Program Designed for Minority, Women, and Disadvantaged Businesses in Kansas

NetWork Kansas has announced the launch of the Minority and Women Business (MWB) Multiplier Loan Fund. The program will provide a source of gap financing to help for-profit, Kansas minority and women-owned businesses (MBE/WBE) and other disadvantaged business enterprises (DBE). This loan program is a partnership between NetWork Kansas and the Kansas Department of Commerce.

Entrepreneurs will work with a NetWork Kansas resource partner to apply for funds, which can match up to 20% of the private capital invested in a business project. The loan funds can be used for a variety of purposes, including working capital, start-up costs, franchise financing, equipment

loans, and expansion.

Businesses must have obtained a MBE (Minority Business Enterprise), WBE (Women Business Enterprise) or DBE (Disadvantaged Business Enterprise) from the Kansas Department of Commerce Office of Minority and Women Business Development to qualify for funding.

Additional eligibility requirements apply. Businesses can apply for a minimum loan amount of \$25,000 and a maximum loan amount of \$500,000. The MWB Multiplier Loan Fund has no collateral requirements and low, fixed interest rates.

Kansas has awarded a quarter of its loans to female-owned businesses. Until now we haven't had programs specifically catering to this demographic," explained NetWork Kansas Senior Product Manager, Jamie Hofling. "It is evident that in the past few decades women-owned and minority-owned businesses are on the rise and it's great to be in the position to offer a program that supports this continued growth. We hope this program will be a source not only of capital, but of confidence."

The MWB Multiplier Loan Fund is the first loan program from NetWork Kansas specifically designed to encourage entrepreneurial growth in these demographic sectors. Most of NetWork Kansas' other loan programs are geographically targeted, and provide matching capital to businesses in rural or distressed communities.

Since 2007, NetWork Kansas has loaned or granted almost \$13 million dollars to 377 Kansas businesses through the StartUp Kansas, Entrepreneurship Community Partnership, and Kansas Capital Multiplier Loan Programs and leveraged an additional \$127 million dollars, for a total investment of \$150 million dollars into Kansas businesses.

involved, firm and confident, and scouts new opportunities for provisions. They take position for battle AND they take care of their own. Deer are peaceful, passive and run away when frightened.

Strong leaders listen to staff. Take this simple test to check your listening skills. At the end of your week, write three things – learned from employees that week. Examples: insight about customer, better way – handle process, reasons why project didn’t work. So much – learn from employees. If you can’t list at least three things per week, you may not be listening carefully enough.

Nurture and Inspire: You can be a great leader without degrading others as you move forward, in your career, or as a leader or coach. Always be mindful of other people’s feelings and to never jump to conclusions about their behavior. No one knows what challenge they may be dealing with.

Positive Influence: We all have a need for a sense of belonging and do things that make people feel included. Leaders let others know that they are valued members of the team. Female leaders are particularly talented at helping their employees feel like they belong. Talk to each employee as a human with needs, emotions and goals. Develop an other-person mindset. Begin looking for ways to include others. Caring means a genuine concern for others that can create a more productive work atmosphere.


